## ABOUT AIREA

All India Rice Exporters' Association (AIREA) is the apex trade body of rice exporters of India. It has been constantly serving the rice trade since its inception in 1989.

Rice is staple food for half of the world's population and 90% of global rice production is in India and other Asian countries. India is the second largest producer of rice after China. In the financial year 2024-25, India exported approximately 20.19 million metric tonnes (MMT) of rice, comprising around 6.06 MMT of Basmati rice and 14.12 MMT of non-Basmati rice, according to data from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCIIS). During April 2025 to February 2026, the export of Basmati rice was recorded at 60,71,565 MTs, where the export of Non Basmati Rice is 13,391,195 MTs.

India has attained this stature post green revolution of 70's and over the years through infusion of latest technologies and improvised agronomic practices, yields have also improved. Today India is net exporter of rice after meeting its domestic consumption demand and buffer stock norms. While Non Basmati rice is cultivated across states in the country, Basmati rice as Geographical Indication (GI) product is grown only under the foothills of Himalayas encompassing the states of Punjab, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, Western Uttar Pradesh and three districts of J&K falling in the Jammu Division.

AIREA facilitates its member exporters in liaison with various State and Central Government agencies in regard to various trade issues and policy matters. It maintains close liaison with The Agricultural & Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Agriculture, National Plant Protection Organization (NPPO) and state Agriculture Departments etc. AIREA helps exporters with market intelligence, market leads, regulatory issues and participation in various exhibitions, trade fairs in India and overseas.

AIREA also assists the Government of India in framing rice related policies in the best interest of trade and the country.

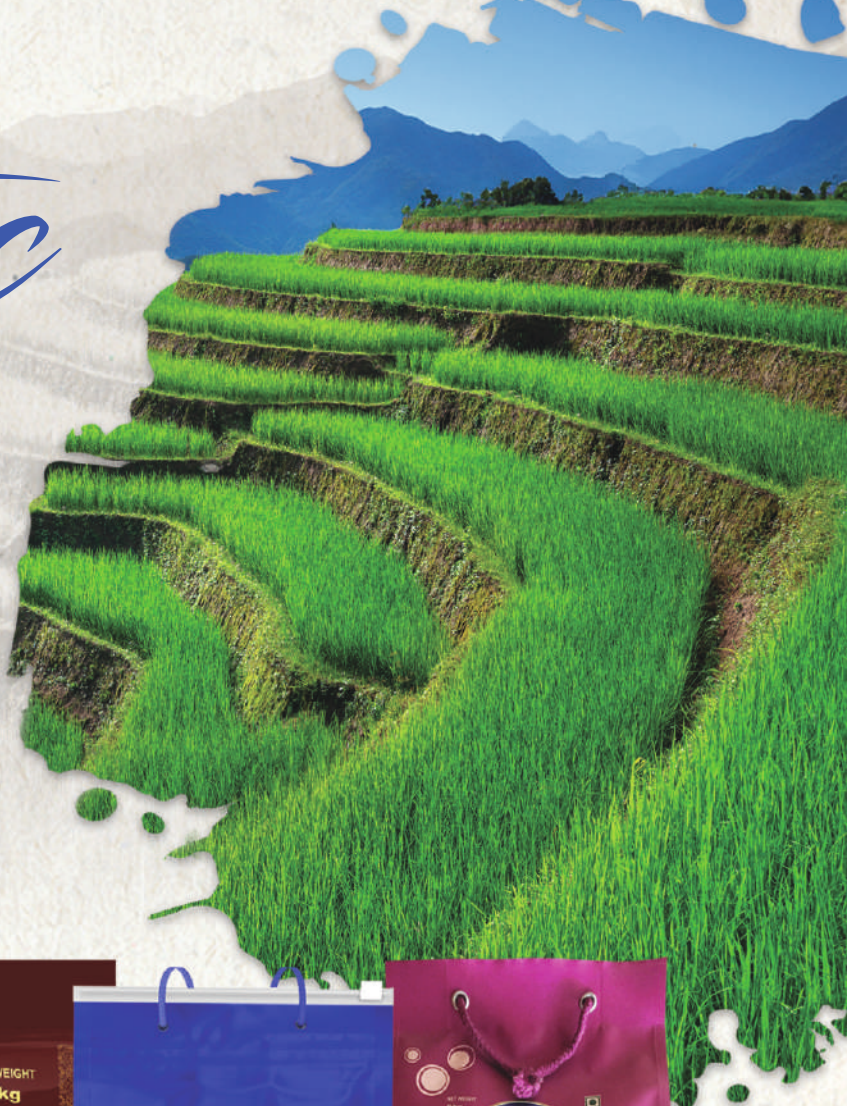

# Steering through Uncertainty: AIREA

Charts the Course for India's Rice Exports  
Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh | March 14–15, 2026



Against the serene backdrop of Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh, All India Rice Exporters Association (AIREA) convened its 3rd Governing Body Meeting at a moment when global calm was anything but assured. Beneath the surface of industry discussions lay a shared recognition: the rules of international trade are being rewritten in real time.

The ongoing Iran–USA–Israel conflict has injected volatility into global markets, and for India's rice exporters, the ripple effects are tangible—disrupted shipping lanes, rising costs, fragile payment cycles, and unpredictable demand patterns. What emerged from this meeting was not alarm, but a clear-eyed recalibration of strategy.



## A Market in Flux, an Industry in Transition

From the outset, the tone was pragmatic. Industry leaders acknowledged that uncertainty is no longer episodic—it is structural.

Markets are behaving unevenly. Saudi Arabia, traditionally a strong pillar of demand, is expected to revive post-Eid, though consumption patterns are evolving under domestic policy pressures. Iraq remains price-sensitive, while Afghanistan has emerged as a relatively stable—though cautiously

watched—destination.

In such an environment, the industry is moving decisively toward risk containment over aggressive expansion.



## The Shift That Can No Longer Be Delayed

A clear theme emerged from the discussions: traditional trade practices built on extended credit arrangements are steadily giving way to more secure and structured frameworks.

This evolution is not just a matter of preference—it reflects a deeper, structural shift in how Indian rice engages with global markets. Exporters are increasingly prioritizing mechanisms that ensure earlier clarity on risk transfer and stronger safeguards around payments.

Payment security has taken center stage. With geopolitical tensions amplifying default risks, exporters are looking to institutions like ECGC for stronger, more responsive coverage. At the same time, there is growing insistence that war-related costs—freight surcharges, insurance premiums, port disruptions—must be borne by buyers, not absorbed by exporters.

Yet, as several members pointed out, alignment within the industry remains a work in progress.

Fragmented practices weaken negotiating power. A unified stance is no longer optional—it is strategic necessity.



### Logistics, Policy, and the Expanding Battlefield

If markets are uncertain, logistics have become equally complex.

Shipping disruptions linked to the conflict have forced exporters to rethink routes, with Khor Fakkan emerging as a strategic alternative corridor. At the same time, rising port charges, detention costs, and ground rents are eroding margins, prompting renewed engagement with government bodies.

AIREA's success in securing relief at Kandla Port stands out as a model of effective advocacy, with similar efforts now focused on Mundra and ICD charges.

Meanwhile, regulatory challenges—from FSSAI norms on grain quality to global scrutiny of pesticides like chlorpyrifos—underscore that competitiveness today extends beyond price. Compliance, sustainability, and reputation are becoming equally critical.



### An Industry Learning Discipline

Perhaps the most striking undercurrent of the meeting was a call for discipline.

In times of uncertainty, markets often swing between extremes—panic selling on one end, speculative

hoarding on the other. Industry leaders cautioned against both.

There was a clear message:

- Avoid unnecessary bullishness
- Resist distress-driven selling
- Maintain pricing integrity

Participants noted, collective restraint can be a competitive advantage—especially when dealing with large, organized global buyers.



### The Road Ahead

India's rice export sector is entering a phase where risk management will define competitiveness as much as cost efficiency once did. The playbook is evolving:

- From volume to value discipline
- From informal practices to structured trade
- From fragmented voices to coordinated action
- From intuition-led decisions to data-driven strategy

In a world where uncertainty is the only constant, the industry's ability to adapt will determine not just survival, but leadership.

And if the deliberations in Dharamshala are any indication, India's rice exporters are not standing still—they are recalibrating, collectively and decisively.

# Basmati Exports under Stress: Middle East Conflict Reshapes Trade Dynamics

(Rising financial risk, logistics shocks, and policy gaps test the resilience of India's premium rice sector)

New Delhi | March 25, 2026

India's basmati rice export sector—long regarded as one of the country's most stable and high-value agri-export segments—is confronting an inflection point. The ongoing geopolitical conflict in the Middle East has begun to disrupt trade flows in a region that accounts for a significant share of India's basmati shipments, triggering a cascade of financial, logistical, and operational challenges.



At a high-level consultation convened at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, on March 25, 2026, policymakers and industry leaders engaged in a candid assessment of the situation. Representatives from MoC, APEDA, DGFT, ECGC, BEDF, and leading exporters under the aegis of AIREA participated in the dialogue, which reflected both urgency and cautious alignment on the way forward.

The consensus was clear: the sector is navigating a risk environment that is both immediate and evolving, requiring coordinated intervention rather than incremental adjustments.



## A Market Disrupted: Demand Uncertainty and Payment Risk

The Middle East has historically been a cornerstone market for Indian basmati, valued for its premium quality and strong consumer preference. However, the current conflict has altered buyer behavior in noticeable ways.

Exporters reported:

- Increased instances of contract renegotiations and shipment deferrals
- Heightened payment delays and credit risk, and
- Reduced visibility on forward demand.

For an export ecosystem that relies heavily on predictable trade cycles and tight working capital management, these disruptions are already translating into liquidity stress.

Industry stakeholders emphasized that financial risk mitigation is now central to sustaining export momentum. Among the key measures discussed:

- Expansion of ECGC coverage to reflect heightened geopolitical risk exposure
- Faster and more flexible claims processing mechanisms, and
- Extension of packing credit timelines from 180 days to 270 days to align with elongated trade cycles.

These interventions are increasingly seen as necessary buffers rather than temporary relief measures.



### Logistics Shock: When Freight Becomes the Constraint

If market uncertainty is eroding confidence, logistics costs are eroding viability.

Since the onset of the conflict, exporters have faced a sharp escalation in shipping-related expenses:

- Ocean freight rates have risen to \$2,000–\$4,000 per container
- Emergency Cost Surcharges (ECS) and War Risk Surcharges (WRS) have surged to \$4,000–\$5,000, often exceeding base freight costs
- Container detention charges have increased to \$40–\$80 per day, and
- Cargo dwell times at Inland Container Depots (ICDs) have extended up to 30 days.

The combined effect is a significant distortion in cost structures. In many cases, logistics is no longer a pass-through cost but a margin-defining factor.

Exporters noted that such volatility makes pricing decisions increasingly complex, particularly in competitive markets where buyers are resistant to absorbing additional costs.



### ICD Congestion: A Domestic Bottleneck with Global Impact

Operational inefficiencies within India’s logistics infrastructure are compounding external pressures. ICDs, particularly ICD Kandla, have emerged as critical pressure points.

Key concerns include:

- Congestion and delays in cargo handling,
- High plugging charges for reefer containers, and
- Limited transparency in ancillary cost structures.

At a time when exporters require agility and predictability, these bottlenecks are slowing cargo movement and increasing turnaround times.

Industry recommendations focused on:

- Rationalizing plugging charges, especially for temperature-sensitive shipments,
- Moderating rail freight costs for port-ICD connectivity, and
- Introducing greater transparency and standardization in ICD-related charges.

### Shipping Practices in Flux

Beyond cost escalation, exporters are also contending with evolving shipping practices that add to operational complexity.

Challenges include:

- Frequent destination amendments due to changing risk assessments by shipping lines,
- Limited vessel availability on certain routes, and
- Lack of consistency in surcharge application.

These factors are reducing execution certainty, making it difficult for exporters to commit to delivery schedules with confidence.



The proposed establishment of a dedicated Point of Contact (POC) under DG Shipping is expected to improve coordination and provide a formal channel for issue escalation. However, industry sentiment suggests that responsiveness and turnaround time will determine its effectiveness.

### Policy Gaps in a Rapidly Changing Environment

The consultation also highlighted the need for policy agility in the face of rapidly evolving trade conditions.

Two areas emerged as immediate priorities:

#### 1. RoDTEP Clarity:

With the March 31 deadline approaching, exporters are seeking clarity on eligibility, timelines, and procedural requirements to ensure continuity of benefits.

#### 2. Surcharge Exemption Window:

The current 15-day window for war-related surcharge exemptions is widely seen as inadequate given the scale of disruption. Industry has proposed extending this period to 40 days for shipments loaded between March 1 and March 31.

The underlying concern is that static policy frameworks may not be sufficient in a dynamic risk environment.



### Towards a Coordinated Response Mechanism

AIREA’s proposal to establish a “Crisis Monitor Group” reflects a broader recognition that the sector requires an institutionalized response mechanism.

Such a platform—bringing together ECGC, RBI, DG Shipping, APEDA, and industry representatives—could:

- Enable real-time monitoring of trade and risk indicators,

- Facilitate faster policy adjustments, and
- Improve coordination across financial, logistics, and regulatory domains.

This marks a shift from reactive problem-solving to proactive risk management at the sectoral level.



### Implications for the Value Chain

The impact of these disruptions extends beyond exporters. The basmati ecosystem—including millers, traders, and farmers—is closely linked to export performance.

Sustained uncertainty in key markets could:

- Affect procurement cycles,
- Influence price realization at the farm level, and
- Alter planting decisions in the upcoming season.

In this context, maintaining export stability is not just a trade priority but a value chain imperative.

### Conclusion: A Test of Resilience and Responsiveness

The March 25 consultation underscores a shared understanding between government and industry: the current disruption is significant, but manageable with timely and coordinated action.

India’s basmati sector has demonstrated resilience in the past, but the present challenge is distinct in its geopolitical dimension and systemic impact.

The path forward will depend on:

- Speed and flexibility in policy response,
- Strengthening of financial risk frameworks, and
- Improvements in logistics efficiency and coordination.

As the Middle East situation continues to evolve, the sector’s ability to adapt will determine whether this phase becomes a temporary disruption—or a longer-term structural shift in trade dynamics.

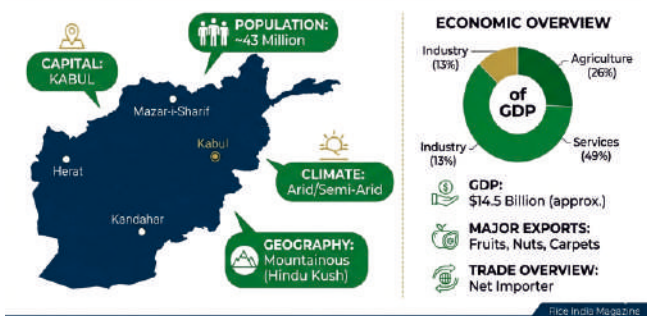
## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

- **Location:** Central/South Asia (Landlocked)
- **Capital:** Kabul
- **Population (2025/26):** ~43–45 million

## Rice Industry Overview: A Structural Deficit Market

Afghanistan's rice sector is defined by a **significant gap between domestic production and consumption**, making it a consistent net importer.

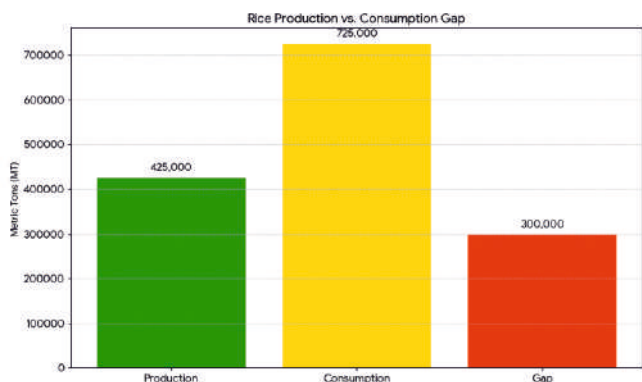
- **Total Consumption:** ~700,000 – 750,000 MT annually
- **Domestic Production:** ~400,000 – 450,000 MT
- **Import Requirement:** ~250,000 – 300,000 MT
- **Per Capita Consumption:** ~18–20 kg/year

## AGRICULTURE OVERVIEW

Agriculture is the backbone of the Afghan livelihood, employing over 60% of the workforce. While wheat is the primary staple, rice holds the second-most important position in the national diet and agricultural hierarchy.

Local production meets only about **55–60% of demand**, with the remainder fulfilled through imports. This structural gap creates **sustained opportunities for exporting countries**, particularly in the premium rice segment.

- **Major Crops:** Wheat, Rice, Barley, Maize, Fruits (Grapes, Pomegranates), and Nuts.

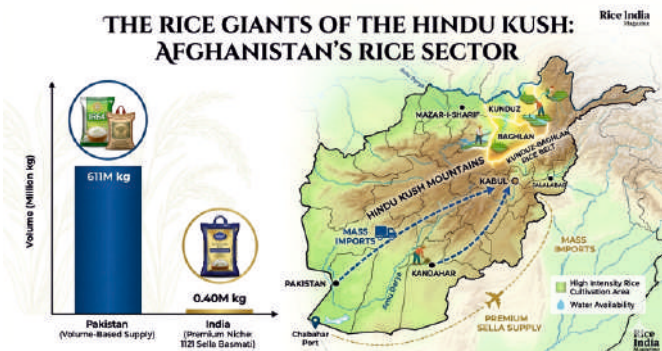

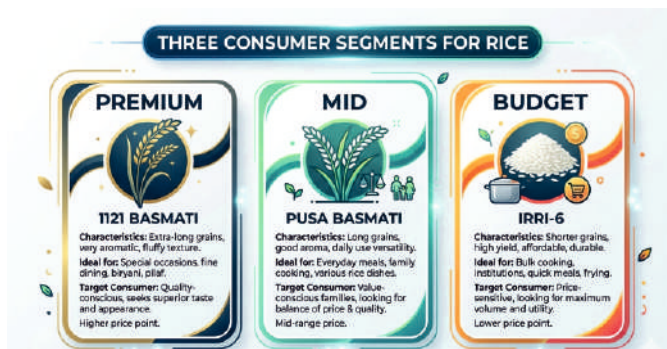

- **Non-Basmati (PR11, Ir64):** Preferred by budget-conscious urban households and for daily use.
- **Pusa Basmati:** A popular hybrid offering a balance of aroma and affordability.



### Import Dynamics: Pakistan Dominates, India Leads Premium Segment

Afghanistan’s rice import market is both **price-sensitive and quality-conscious**. Key Suppliers (2024–25 Estimates)

- **Pakistan:** Dominates with 70–90% share due to proximity and cost advantages
- **India:** Strong presence in premium Basmati segment
- **Others:** Kazakhstan, Vietnam, Uzbekistan (limited share)



### Local Varieties

- **Bara:** Aromatic rice from Nangarhar
- **Lawangi / Luka:** Regional specialty varieties
- **Shali / Shola:** Traditional local paddy types

While local rice is valued for its **authentic taste**, limited production and inconsistent quality restrict its market share.

Pakistan supplies bulk quantities of **IRRI-6, IR64, and Sella rice**, while India caters to **high-end urban markets with 1121 Basmati and Pusa varieties**.

A notable trend is the **growing preference for Indian 1121 Basmati** in cities like Kabul and Mazar-i-Sharif due to:

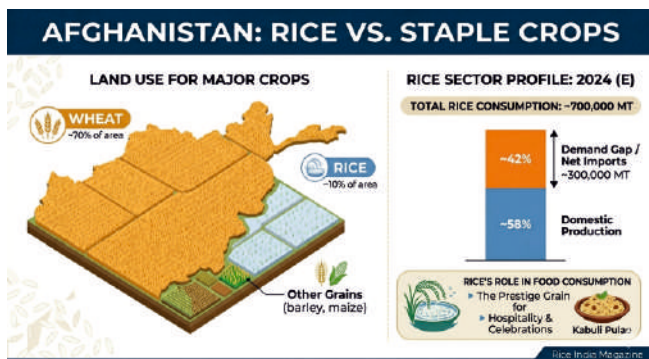

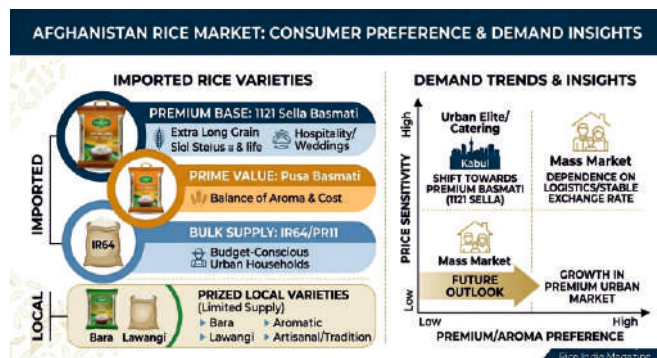

**RELIEF Component-I: Export Credit Support for ECGC's already insured exporters**

6. This component shall apply to exporters who have already obtained ECGC credit insurance cover and whose consignments are destined, either for delivery or for transshipment, to the specified countries in the affected Gulf and West Asia region and in respect of which onboard bill of lading as well as in case of air shipments where airway bill has been issued during the eligible period.

6.1. ECGC shall ensure that the premium amount for the already ECGC-covered exporters is not increased beyond the pre-disruption level for the eligible period.

6.2. The assistance under this component shall be:

- Applicable for shipments in respect of which onboard bill of lading or airway bill has been issued between **February 14, 2026 – March 15, 2026**;
- Provided for shipments - **Full Container Load (FCL), Less than Container Load (LCL) or Reefer containers (perishable cargo)** - destined for countries such as United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Israel, Kuwait, Qatar, Oman, Bahrain, Iraq, Iran and Yemen for delivery or for transshipment.
- To cover losses arising due to **war-related risks and associated political risks in the affected countries**;
- To enable ECGC to provide enhanced cover of up to 100% of loss, subject to approved terms and verification.
- To reimburse ECGC for the amount that it shall pay to the exporters for such compensation in excess of the amount that is payable under their existing ECGC policy cover.

6.3. The assistance under this component shall not be applicable for back-to-town cargo cases. Such cases shall continue to be covered as per their existing ECGC policy cover. No reimbursement shall be made to ECGC for such cases under this component.

6.4. Government support under this Component-I is estimated at **₹56 crores**, for the limited intervention window under the RELIEF proposal, to enable ECGC to extend compensation up to 100% of loss, over and above the coverage ordinarily admissible under the relevant policy.

**RELIEF Component-II: Encourage and facilitate ECGC coverage for Export Credit Support for upcoming exports in the region**

7. This Component is meant to encourage exporters to opt for ECGC's credit insurance cover under standalone policies for coverage of their consignments, destined, either for delivery or for transshipment, to the specified countries in the affected Gulf and West Asia region. The back-to-town cargo cases will not be eligible under the component.



**Resilience & Logistics Intervention for Export Facilitation (RELIEF) under Export Promotion Mission (EPM)**

1. The Gulf and West Asia region constitutes a strategically significant trade corridor for India. Recent geopolitical developments in West Asia, particularly the escalation of tensions involving Iran and the evolving security environment around the Strait of Hormuz and the wider Gulf maritime corridor, have led to disruptions in maritime logistics arrangements. Shipping lines and insurers have imposed a number of additional charges on cargo moving through the region, including **Additional War Risk Premiums (AWRP), War Risk Surcharges (WRS), Emergency Conflict Surcharges (ECS)** and other extraordinary freight levies.

2. These developments have resulted in a sudden escalation in outbound logistics costs for exporters, driven by vessel diversions, longer maritime routes, higher insurance premia, and congestion at regional transshipment hubs.

3. Given the strategic importance of the Gulf and West Asia region for India's merchandise exports, prolonged logistics disruptions and extraordinary freight surcharges, a calibrated, time-limited, targeted and exceptional intervention under the Export Promotion Mission (EPM), called **RELIEF - Resilience & Logistics Intervention for Export Facilitation**, has been approved to support Indian exporters.

4. The approved intervention – RELIEF - shall consist of **three complementary components** aimed at addressing the principal stress points faced by the exporters, namely: -

- (i) enhanced war/political risk support for eligible ECGC's already insured exporters;
- (ii) time-limited support to encourage and facilitate ECGC coverage for eligible exporters for upcoming exports; and,
- (iii) time-limited reimbursement support for extraordinary freight and insurance surcharge burden borne by eligible non-ECGC-insured MSME exporters in respect of customs-cleared cargo.

5. Given the experience of ECGC in handling export credit risks and claims administration, ECGC shall act as the nodal and implementing agency for the three interventions under RELIEF, including disbursement and verification, in accordance with Government-approved guidelines.



- 7.1. ECGC shall ensure that the premium paid by the exporters shall not be increased beyond the pre-disruption level for the eligible period.
- 7.2. Assistance under this component shall be:
- Applicable for shipments in respect of which onboard bill of lading and airway bill is granted between **March 16, 2026 – June 15, 2026** excluding energy shipments to the region;
  - Provided for shipments - **Full Container Load (FCL), Less than Container Load (LCL) or Reefer containers (perishable cargo)** - destined for countries such as United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Israel, Qatar, Oman, Bahrain, Iraq, Iran and Yemen for delivery or for transshipment.
  - To cover losses arising due to **war-related risks and associated political risks in the affected countries;**
  - To enable ECGC to provide enhanced cover up to 95% of loss, subject to approved terms and verification.
  - To reimburse ECGC for the amount that it shall pay to the exporters for such compensation in excess of the amount that is payable under the ECGC policy cover.
- 7.3. The assistance under this component shall not be applicable for back-to-town cargo cases. Such cases shall continue to be covered as per their existing ECGC policy cover. No reimbursement shall be made to ECGC for such cases under this component.
- 7.4. Government support under this Component-II is estimated at **₹159 crores**, for the limited intervention window under the RELIEF proposal, to enable ECGC to extend compensation up to 95% of loss, over and above the coverage ordinarily admissible under the relevant policy.
- RELIEF Component-II: Reimbursement support for extraordinary freight and insurance surcharge borne by eligible non-ECGC-insured MSME exporters**
8. Recognising that some **MSME exporters** may not have availed for coverage under ECGC's Credit Insurance Policy, this component shall partially offset losses due to extraordinary logistics costs arising from conflict-related surcharges imposed on Indian exports which are already sailing to the specified countries in the affected Gulf and West Asia regions, either for delivery or for transshipment, for which Onboard Bill of Lading has already been issued for movement to such affected regions.
- 8.1. Eligible expenditure shall be limited to additional freight or insurance costs borne by the exporter or reduction in realised export proceeds attributable to such extraordinary surcharges, on account of increased freight or insurance costs. This would include:
- War Risk Surcharge (WRS)/Emergency Conflict Surcharge (ECS) or similar levies;
  - Additional War Risk Premium (AWRP);
  - Additional conflict-related shipping charges linked to maritime route disruptions; and,



- 8.2. Assistance under this component shall be:
- Applicable for shipments in respect of which Onboard Bill of Lading has been granted between **February 14, 2026 – March 15, 2026;**
  - Restricted to **Micro, Small and Medium enterprises**, as defined under the MSME classification framework;
  - Provided for shipments - **Full Container Load (FCL), Less than Container Load (LCL) or Reefer containers (perishable cargo)** - destined for countries such as United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Israel, Qatar, Oman, Bahrain, Iraq, Iran and Yemen for delivery or for transshipment.
  - For **CIF contracts**, reimbursement of upto **50% of the additional freight and insurance burden actually borne by the exporter**, subject to production of prescribed documentary evidence, shall be provided;
  - For **FOB contracts**, reimbursement of upto **50% of the reduction between the contracted FOB value and the realised export proceeds** shall be provided. **The same shall, however, be done only where such reduction is demonstrably and solely attributable to extraordinary freight or insurance surcharge linked to the present disruption**, as evidenced by such documents as may be prescribed, including contractual amendment, debit note, buyer communication, bank realisation record, or equivalent proof.
  - The back-to-town cargo cases will not be eligible under the component.
- 8.3. The total assistance per IEC shall be subject to:
- the extent of actual loss incurred by the exporter in respect of the eligible invoice,
  - submission of prescribed documents, and,
  - an overall ceiling of **₹50 lakh per exporter** in respect of all eligible consignments under this component.
- 8.4. The estimated Government support requirement under this Component-III is **₹282 Crores** for the time-limited intervention window under the RELIEF proposal.
9. The total expenditure for the RELIEF intervention to an extent of **Rs.497 Crore** shall be met from the existing budgetary allocation under the Export Promotion Mission, and, shall be made on actuals subject to budget availability, verification, and such operational safeguards as may be prescribed.
10. The **EPM Steering Committee** may review the interventions under RELIEF proposal based on evolving geopolitical conditions and recommend modification, extension or withdrawal of the component as appropriate, including *inter se* transfer of funds among the components as well as prescription of negative list of goods for exclusion from any of the

In compliance with the directives of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways dated 06.03.2026 regarding mitigation measures to address the challenges arising out of geo-political disturbances in the Middle East, Deendayal Port Authority (DPA), Kandla has issued the following Trade Notices to facilitate trade and minimize the impact on exporters:

1. **Traffic/Shipping/4784/MiddleEastIssue/2026/195 (16.03.2026)**
  - o Terminal Operator (KICT) shall grant 100% waiver on ground rent/dwell time charges for a period of 15 days (from 0000 hours on 28.02.2026 up to 2400 hours on 14.03.2026) for containers lying inside the terminal from 28.02.2026 or those which had gated in till to 0700 hours on 08.03.2026.
  - o Further, 80% waiver on reefer plug-in charges has been provided for the same period for stranded reefer containers carrying perishable cargo, under the above conditions.
2. **Traffic/Shipping/4784/MiddleEastIssue/2026/196 (24.03.2026)**
  - o In continuation of the above, the Competent Authority has approved extension of the waiver benefits up to 31.03.2026, to ensure continued support to the trade.

components of the RELIEF intervention.

11. The claims shall be processed in order of receipt, subject to eligibility, verification, and availability of funds within the approved financial ceiling, and the total Government liability under this intervention shall not exceed the budgetary allocation approved under the Export Promotion Mission. ECGC shall maintain a real-time monitoring dashboard of claims processed and balance funds available under the intervention.

12. The intervention under Export Promotion Mission will support continuity of India's exports to Gulf and West Asia markets during the disruption period, reduce the financial burden of extraordinary freight and insurance costs on exporters, prevent export order cancellations and supply chain disruptions and protect employment and value chains in export sectors.

**Subject: Continuation of RoDTEP Scheme beyond March 31, 2026**

S.O. (E): In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 5 of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992, read with Para 1.02 of the Foreign Trade Policy, 2023, as amended from time to time, the Central Government hereby makes the following amendment in the Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) Scheme:

The RoDTEP Scheme shall continue for all eligible export products for a further period of six months with effect from April 01, 2026, to September 30, 2026.

The rates and value caps as notified in Appendix 4R and Appendix 4RE, as applicable on March 31, 2026, shall continue unchanged during the aforesaid period.

The other terms and conditions governing the Scheme shall remain unchanged.

Effect of this notification:

Eligible exports made during the period from 01.04.2026 to 30.09.2026 shall continue to be entitled to RoDTEP benefit at the rates and value caps in force as on 31.03.2026, subject to the existing terms and conditions of the Scheme.

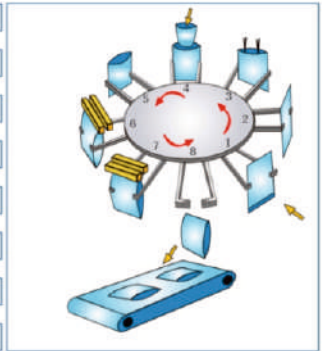

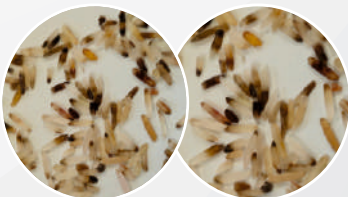
